

Qarz-e-Hasana

Can you help?

Al-Ansaar Welfare & Education is probably the LARGEST basic (primary) Islamic educational project in the history of Preston. We are trying our best to provide Islamic education to young children aged of 4 to 16. Our provision includes acquisition of the best possible resources, teacher training, staff development, a logical approach and most importantly putting parents and children first. From 30 children (in 2002) we currently have nearly 330+ children.

For expansion, and to meet day-to-day costs, we constantly require Qarz-e-Hasana. All amounts are welcome.

1. What is Qarz-e-Hasana?

Qarz-e-Hasana is an interest-free loan given to Masjids/organisations/Darul Uloom. This money enables the organisation to progress without financial hindrances.

2. How is it repaid?

A time is agreed by both parties, and the loan is payable on that date.

3. How do I benefit?

The lender benefits by receiving Thawaab (reward) in the hereafter throughout the loan period. In addition to this, continuous reward is gained through whatever project that came into existence from the loan. It really is a wise investment, as you get your money back – PLUS Thawaab.

4. What if I need my money in a hurry?

The unexpected can always happen, and most institutions understand this. Insha-Allah Al-Ansaar hopes to honour such emergencies upon three weeks notice.

Notes:

1. It is a common myth that a Qarz-e-Hasana is never repaid. This is untrue, and all bona fide organisations try their utmost best to honour repayment dates. In the case of Al-Ansaar, to date we have repaid over a £350,000, and Insha-Allah we will honour any date given at the time of the loan.
2. Al-Ansaar is in need of financial assistance. Besides Lillah contributions, we are accepting Qarz-e-Hasana. We urge ALL parents to give a Qarz-e-Hasana, this could be money that is just lying in the bank and which you do not need in the foreseeable future. A receipt is issued for all monies received.
