

Madrasa Tajweedul Quran

Level 3 – Quran, Tajweed & Surats

First and foremost:

Complete revision of all Tajweed rules within the first week of Madrasa. Quran Sabaq can start from the first day, but at a slow pace. *The revision and understanding of Tajweed rules is essential.*

Quran:

1. Two Siparas to be completed this year.
2. Starting from the 2nd Juz till the end of the 3rd Juz.
3. The average number of lines per day will be 4½. *Refer to the L.T.P. for the annual breakdown.*

Notes on the Quran:

1. One of the core objectives of the Quran in Level 3 is that the class MUST recite in one style by the end of the year. The teacher could also encourage the children to start reciting with a tune.
2. Children must be reciting at least one line in one breath, and making Waqf properly at all times.
3. Tajweed rules need to be emphasised rigorously.
4. A lot of emphasis needs to be given on clarity and slow recitation.

Tajweed Rules:

First complete all the Tajweed rules from Levels 1 and 2 (this must be within a maximum of 6 to 8 weeks). Then the following to be implemented.

1. ALL rules of the letter Raa. This includes:
 - ✓ The basic Raa rules (when to read full and empty mouth)
 - ✓ Raa Saakin rule
 - ✓ Raa Mushaddad rule
2. Ghunna of the letters: YAA, WAW, MEEM and NOON (Yu'min).

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NOTE: Many classes every year cover the Tajweed rules within a few months. If the class is competent in the Tajweed rules of Level 3, the teacher can then introduce the class to the Ikhfaa of Noon Saakin and Tanween. This will help the class immensely and will also improve the overall recitation.

Surats to be memorised:

Revise the following within 8 weeks:

1. Al-Fatiha
2. Al-Ikhlās
3. Al-Kauthar
4. Al-Asr
5. An-Naas

Then:

1. Al Falaq
2. Al Lahab
3. AN Nasr
4. Al Kaafiroon
5. Al Maa'oon
6. Al Quraysh
7. Al Feel

Notes on Surats to be memorised:

1. These need to be distributed evenly throughout the year.
2. Surats must be recited slowly and with Tajweed.
3. The teacher must recite each Surat regularly so that children adapt to the correct recitation and (as an optional extra) the tune.
4. A slip must be sent to parents via the homework diary every time a new Surat is started.
5. When children have school holidays, teachers must take advantage of this and utilise the extra time children have at home.
6. A revision timetable must be in place and regularly updated. *The teacher needs to ensure Surats are listened to everyday.*

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
