

Madrasa Tajweedul Quran

Level 5 – Quran, Tajweed & Surats

First and foremost:

Complete revision of all Tajweed rules within the first week of Madrasa. Quran Sabaq can start from the first day, but at a slow pace. *The revision and understanding of Tajweed rules is essential.*

Quran:

1. Five Siparas to be completed this year.
2. Starting from the 8th Juz till the end of the 12th Juz.
3. The average number of lines per day will be 12 (this is an approximate figure). *Refer to the L.T.P. for the annual breakdown.*

Notes on the Quran:

1. After Level 4, the class must be reciting the Quran with fluency and full Tajweed. *Hence this needs to be maintained in Level 5. The standard must not drop.*
2. Teachers must start **emphasising on reciting with** a tune from the beginning of the year, and reciting in longer breaths.
3. At no point must the level of Tajweed and fluency “drop”. This usually occurs when teachers become “relaxed” and complacent. It is essential pupils are constantly asked questions relating to Tajweed.

Tajweed Rules:

Within the first 8 weeks, all the rules from Levels 1 to 4 needs to explained and revised.

Surats to be memorised:

Revise the following within 12 weeks:

1. Al-Fatiha

2. Al-Ikhlās
3. Al-Kauthar
4. Al-Asr
5. An-Naas
6. Al Falaq
7. Al Lahab
8. AN Nasr
9. Al Kaafiroon
10. Al Maoo'on
11. Al Quraysh
12. Al Feel
13. Al Lumazah
14. Al Takathur
15. Al qaria'h
16. Aadiyaat

Then:

1. Al Zilzaal
2. Al Qadr
3. Wat Teen
4. Alam Nashrah
5. Wadhuhaa

Notes on Surats to be memorised:

1. These need to be distributed evenly throughout the year.
2. Surats must be recited slowly and with Tajweed.
3. The teacher must recite each Surat regularly so that children adapt to the correct recitation and (as an optional extra) the tune.
4. A slip must be sent to parents via the homework diary every time a new Surat is started.
5. When children have school holidays, teachers must take advantage of this and utilise the extra time children have at home.
6. A revision timetable must be in place and regularly updated. *The teacher needs to ensure Surats are listened to everyday.*
